Local action for adaptation


>> The local level as the bedrock of adaptation.

Mission objective:

To help at least 150 European regions, local authorities and communities towards climate resilience by 2030.

>> 308 regional and Local authorities have adhered. They have a mandate for climate action on the territory









The challenge of financing adaptation

- Large cost of inaction: EUR 52,3 billion estimated in 2022
- Massive and increasing investments needed:
 between EUR 35 billion and 500 billions annually



>> Today, **public funding** is the main source of investment in adaptation.

>> **Private funding** has to be leveraged to meet the needs.
