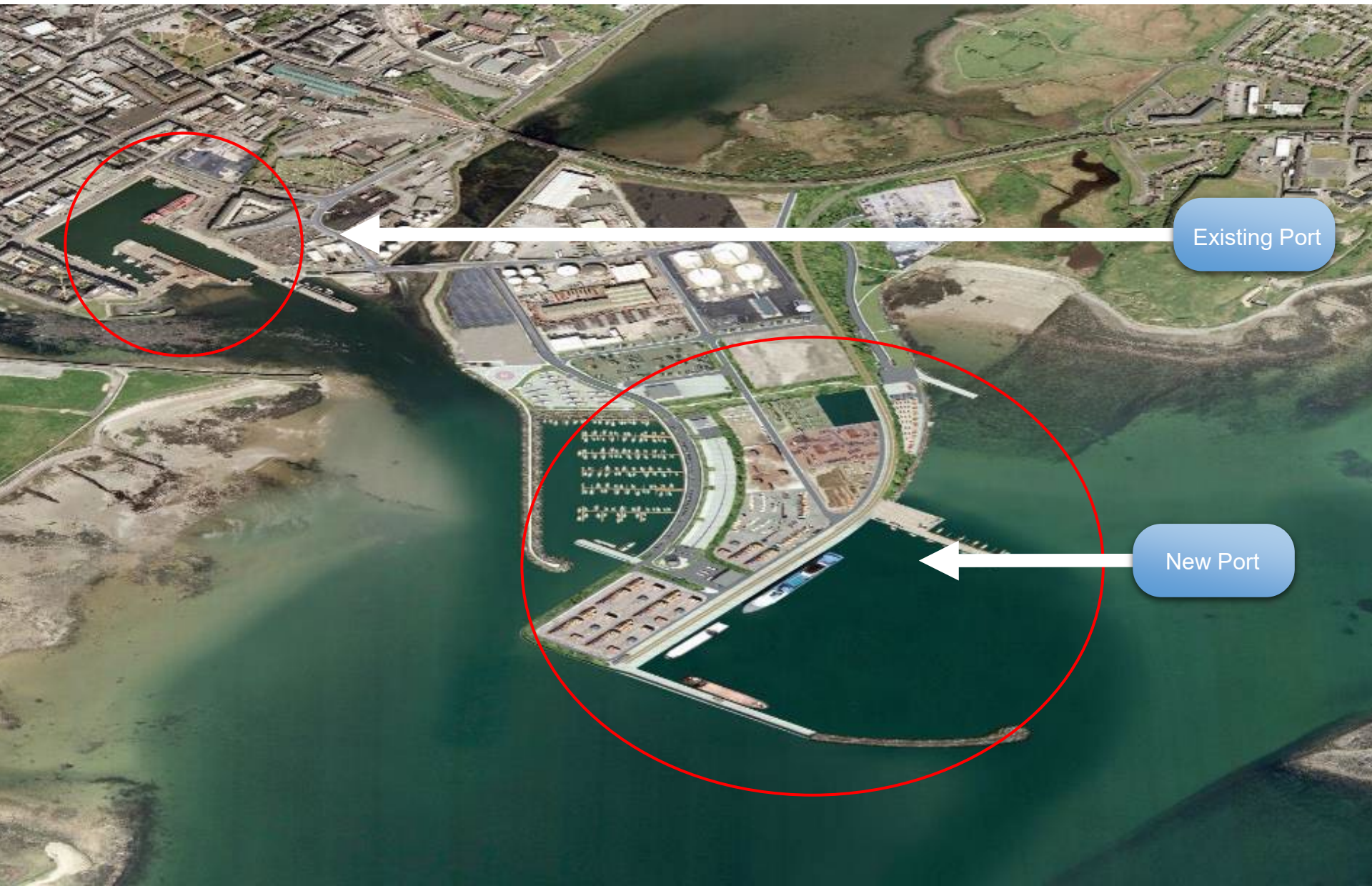

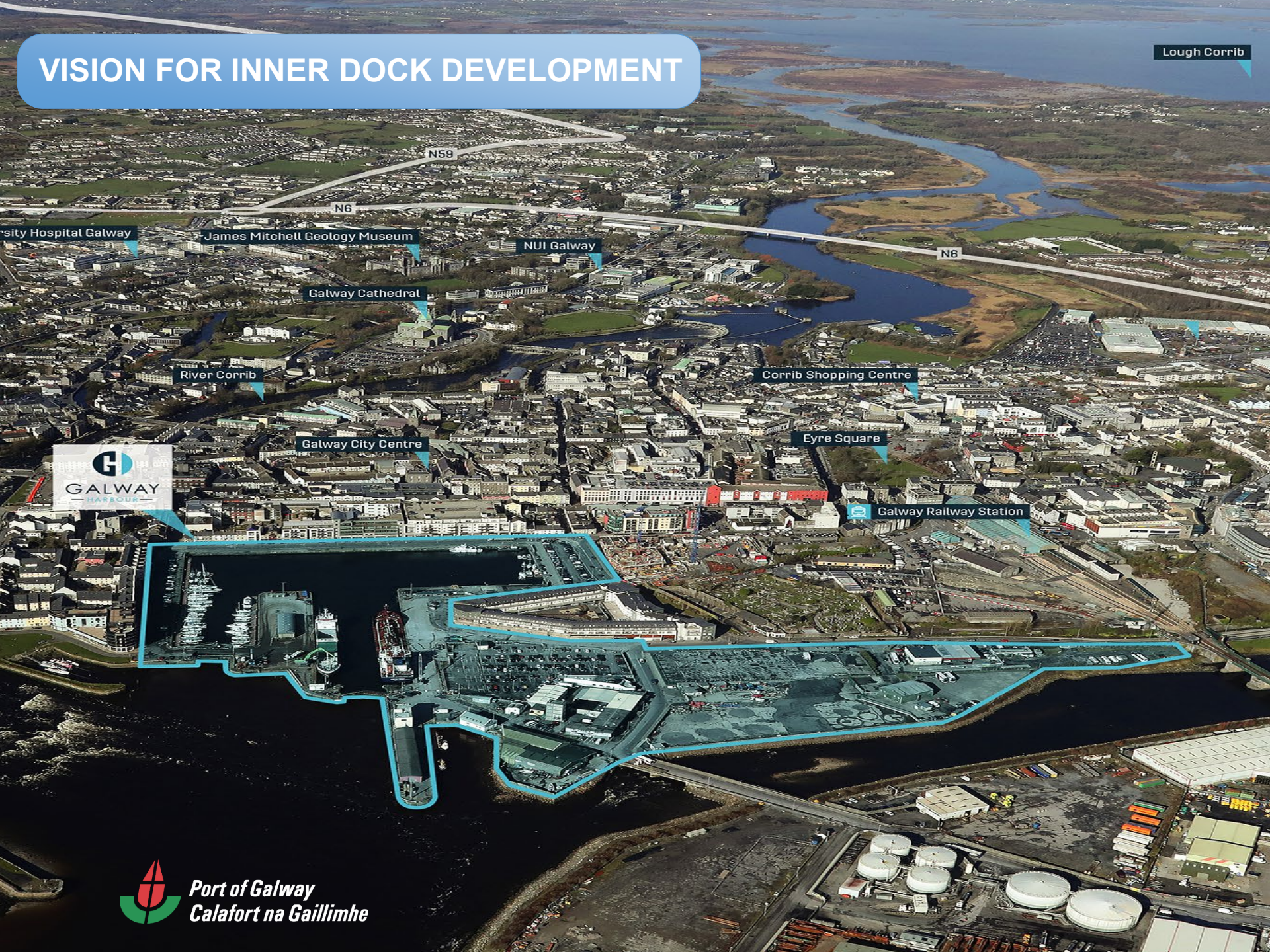

- Cargo and ferry services to the Aran Islands

THE PORT AS AN ENERGY HUB

- Local hydrogen distribution
- Support services for offshore wind
- Research and development
- Professional services
- Onshore wind



OFFSHORE WIND - A key strategic opportunity for Ireland

- National Objectives
 - 5GW by 2030
 - 37GW by 2050
- Fixed, then floating; East, then West coasts
- Our NUTS 2 Region has the best windspeeds in Europe
- Significant investment in port infrastructure required
- Policy statement on the facilitation of Offshore Renewable Energy by Commercial Ports - December 2021
- Port policy review commenced in October 2023
- Multiple governments departments engaged in work in this area



ONSHORE WIND

- 2022/23 projects – c.250MW and approximately 35 ships.
- 0.6GW of onshore wind processed through Galway by end of 2023.
- Strong outlook for 2024 and beyond.
- Port performance measurement and onshore/offshore wind

 - New Port infrastructure
 - Urban regeneration
 - Renewable energy, including hydrogen
- A project of scale
