


Danish 2021–2027 Program

- €240 million for ERDF in Denmark
 - €71 million for PO2: A Green Europe
- Country specific recommendations:
 - Promote innovation in SMEs
 - Promote green transition
- Key learnings from 2014-2020 programming
 - Too many projects about saving small amounts of energy
 - Too little focus on saving ressources
- Political mandate (Danish government) for supporting circular economy






Challenges in programming





ERDF Priority 2: Green Transition in SMEs

- **Objective 2.vi:** To promote the transition to a circular and ressource-efficient economy
- Main target groups: SMEs and entrepreneurs
- Types of activities
 - Development of circular business models, partnerships, or processes
 - Test and demonstration of circular solutions
 - Knowledge about green transition and circular economy
 - Implementation and scaling

- 50,3 mio. EUR (375.756.381,28 kr.)
- Assessed through pre-defined criteria

- €16 million in EU co-financing
- €9 million in national cofinancing

- Across sectors and country


Broad consortium
