Climate proofing in Cohesion Policy: Legal framework

Regulation 2021/1060 (Common Provisions Regulation)

Recital (10) of the CPR

Reflecting the importance of tackling climate change in line with the Union's commitments to implement the Paris Agreement, [...] the Funds should support activities that would respect the climate and environmental standards and priorities of the Union and would do no significant harm to environmental objectives [...]. Adequate mechanisms to ensure the climate proofing of supported investment in infrastructure should be an integral part of programming and implementation of the Funds.

Article 73(2) of the CPR: Selection of operations by managing authorities

In selecting operations, the managing authority shall: [...]

(j) ensure the climate proofing of investments in infrastructure which have an expected lifespan of at least 5 years



Climate proofing of infrastructure in the 2021-2027 period

Article 2 of the CPR: Definitions

(42) 'climate proofing' means a process to prevent infrastructure from being vulnerable to potential long-term climate impacts whilst ensuring that the 'energy efficiency first' principle is respected and that the level of greenhouse gas emissions arising from the project is consistent with the climate neutrality objective in 2050;

This guidance on the climate proofing of infrastructure forms part of t

rogrammes of the Union where relevant, is also envisaged under Regulation (EU) 2021/1153 of the European Parliam and of the Council (2) (CEF Regulation).

The guidance is also deemed a relevant reference for the climate proofing of infrastructure under Article 2(37) and Article 67(3) jol of Regulation (EU) 2021/1060 of the European Parliament and of the Council (*) (Common Provisions Regulation (CPR)) as well as under the Recovery and Resilience Facility (*).
