





National SUMP Support Programme (NSSP) in-presence Workshop Athens December 2024

The European Investment Bank EIB-JASPERS Technical Advisory team is holding a series of workshops on topics relating to National SUMP Support Programmes (NSSPs) in different EU Member States, free-of-charge for participants.

The second **NSSP in-presence workshop** for EU Member State representatives supporting the development and implementation of SUMPs takes place on **Tuesday 10**th **and Wednesday 11**th **December** at the <u>Moxy</u> **Athens City Hotel**, Stadiou 65, Athens 105 51, Greece.

The purpose of the event is to discuss NSSPs, to showcase best practice examples and to identify NSSP related challenges and recommendations for national and regional authorities, the European Commission and for the 431 urban nodes on the TEN-T network. This event will build on the outcomes of the NSSP Workshop that took place in Brussels in October 2024, including further presentations from national ministries on their NSSPs, giving participants further ideas on the development of their own NSSPs.
